Long residence

In order to qualify for 'home' fees under this category, all of the following criteria (a) to (d) must be met:

- (a) on the first day of the first academic year of the course, you must either be:
 - (i) under the age of 18 and have lived in the *UK* throughout the seven-year period preceding the *first day of the first academic year of the course*; or
 - (ii) aged 18 years old or above and, preceding the *first day of the* <u>first</u> academic year of the course, have lived in the UK throughout either:
 - (aa) half your life; or
 - (bb) a period of twenty-years
- (b) you must be *ordinarily resident* in the *UK* on the *first day of the first academic year of the course*
- (c) you must have been *ordinarily resident* in the *UK and Islands* throughout the three-year period preceding the *first day of the <u>first academic year of the course</u>*

<u>Note:</u> See our definition of *ordinary residence*, including the need for residence to be / have been lawful.

(d) the main purpose for your residence in the *UK and Islands* must not have been to receive full-time education during any part of that three-year period

<u>Tip</u> if you were in full-time education at some point during the three years, then ask yourself: If I had not been in education, where would I have been? If the answer is that you would have been somewhere in the UK and Islands anyway, then you meet criterion (d).
