Next summer, the UK government plans to launch the new Graduate Immigration Route, a new visa designed to allow many 2021 graduates to stay and work in the UK, initially for two years (three years for PhD students).

This session breaks down what the government has announced so far about the Graduate route, what is still unknown, and what new work opportunities the Graduate route would open up for you. We will also summarise the separate options for 2021 graduates who want to switch straight to a visa for sponsored skilled work or endorsed entrepreneurial activities.

IMMIGRATION POLICY: WHAT'S NEXT?

This will be particularly useful for any students from the European Economic Area who are new to the student visa rules and need to understand what they will need to do after the UK leaves the EU.
